


During the course of research, the research team travelled approximately 1,50,000 kilometres and spent some 1,460 days researching and interviewing more than 5000 people directly or indirectly associated with Jaipur,



ranging from chairmen emeritus to vegetable-sellers. People from diverse backgrounds, poured their hearts out to narrate fascinating stories, inspirational anecdotes, opinions, and vignettes, providing dramatic insights into this great city. In order to compile this book approximately 1,75,000 pages of archival material were sifted through with other data including old reports, journals, official records of Rajasthan's royal families, and the like.

This eye-catching, large format, richly illustrated book comprises 440 pages with 693 rare visuals, i.e. paintings, lithographs, line-sketches, old maps, artifacts, etc., related to the city of Jaipur. Conceived and written by Dr D.K. Taknet, a well-respected business historian and assisted by a team of research scholars, the book seamlessly blends Jaipur's past with present and future.
